









Tips for a Healthy Classroom

<p>Pest Sightings</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Report pest problems to the custodian. • <i>Note: Pesticide use is prohibited by law in schools.</i> 	
<p>Food</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Whenever possible, do not bring or store food in the classroom • If you must have food, seal it in plastic containers, restrict eating areas (no eating on rugs), and clean-up food and spills immediately. • Report large spills to the custodian immediately. 	
<p>Air Quality and Ventilation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maintain a three foot clearance space around all air vents. • Report moisture problems, odors and any damage to the building materials or ventilation system to the custodian. 	
<p>Plants and Animals</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No plants and animals should be in rooms where students have documented or suspected allergies and asthma. • If there are plants or animals in your classroom, locate them away from the air supply vents to prevent their pollen, fur, feathers, feces, or other byproducts from being circulated throughout the room. • Clean cages and drip pans regularly. 	
<p>Health Reactions</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Report student health reactions to allergens, products, air quality, etc. to the school nurse, and staff health concerns to the principal. 	
<p>Classroom Cleaning</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make room cleanable by keeping surfaces free and preventing clutter. • Store items in shelves and closed bins whenever possible. • Clean throw rugs regularly as they harbor allergens. • Use only cleaners approved for classroom use and supplied by the school-- Do not bring cleaning products or disinfectants from home. • Spray cleaner into the cloth (not into the air) and then wipe. • Store all products in a secured place in an upright position. 	
<p>Curriculum Products</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Whenever possible, use the least hazardous products that have no warning signs or only have a “Caution” warning. • Follow instructions on label and store in a secured location. • Use of hazardous products in schools requires you to obtain, review and file the <i>Safety Data Sheet</i> and to have received Right To Know Training. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Danger: Highest hazard (red text). <i>Imminent hazard could result in death or serious injury</i> ○ Warning: Intermediate hazard (orange text). <i>Hazard could result in death or serious injury</i> ○ Caution: Lowest hazard (yellow text). <i>Hazard could result in minor or moderate injury</i>
